8. VISA AND IMMIGRATION INFORMATION

Please check with your travel agents the appropriate visas and documentation necessary for your entry into Pakistan.

Pakistan has recently introduced a liberalized visa Policy where e-visa and on-arrival visa facilities are available to a number of countries. All foreign nationals coming to Pakistan need a valid passport with a minimum validity of six months beyond the period of stay. Participants are requested to contact Pakistan embassy in their country and ensure that they possess visa for the period of stay in Pakistan. 10. PRACTICAL INFORMATION

About Islamabad:

Combining a rich history, the confluence of many a civilization and temperate climate, Islamabad - the capital city of Pakistan, is one of the most beautiful cities in the South Asian region. Wide, tree-lined streets adorn the various sectors and zones of the city, making it accessible and spectacular. Administratively, the city is located within the Islamabad Capital Territory, which is federally controlled, even though historically Islamabad has been a part of the Punjab province; more specifically the Potohar Plateau. The city was built between 1960 - 1970 to replace Karachi as the capital. It has a population of 2 million and together with its neighbouring twin city of Rawalpindi, the greater Islamabad-Rawalpindi metropolitan area is the third largest in Pakistan with a population of over 4.5 million inhabitants. Weather:

The month of February 2020 is expected to have pleasant weather with temperatures between 19-22 degrees celsius.

Dress:

The dress in public places is usually modest and casual.

Language:

Urdu is the national language but English is widely spoken and understood in the city.

Time Zone:

Pakistan is GMT/UTC +5.

Banks & Currency:

The Pakistani currency unit is Rupee. It is recommended that participants keep some US Dollars in cash for expenses in Islamabad. Larger shops and hotels accept credit cards— mostly VISA, MasterCard and American Express. Bank hours are from 9am to 5pm Monday to Thursday, 9am to 12:30pm & 2:30pm to 5:30pm on Fridays. Bargaining is expected in street markets and small stores. Saturday and Sunday are weekly holidays in the offices.

Electricity:

Electrical current is 230 volts, 50Hz. Round two- or three-pin plugs are used. For other types of plugs converters are easily available in the market.
